1. Purpose

We, Sustainability Accounting Co., Ltd., have been engaged by YAMADA HOLDINGS CO., LTD. (thereinafter "the Company") to provide limited assurance on the Company and its domestic consolidated subsidiaries' performance indicators for the year ended March 31, 2025, which are 36.4 kt-CO₂ for Scope1, 235 kt-CO₂ for market-based Scope2 and 20.4 Mt-CO₂ for Scope3 (Category 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,11,12,14). The purpose of this process is to express our conclusion on whether the CO₂ emissions were calculated in accordance with the Company's standards. The Company's management is responsible for calculating the CO₂ emissions. Our responsibility is to independently carry out a limited assurance engagement and to express our assurance conclusion.

2. Procedures Performed

We conducted our assurance engagement in accordance with International Standard on Assurance Engagement 3000 (ISAE 3000) and 3410 (ISAE3410). The key procedures we carried out included:

- · Interviewing the Company's responsible personnel to understand the Company's standards
- · Reviewing the Company's standards
- Performing cross-checks on a sample basis and performing a recalculation to determine whether the CO₂ emissions were calculated in accordance with the Company's standards.

3. Conclusion

Based on the procedures performed, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the CO₂ emissions have not been calculated in all material respects in accordance with the Company's standards.
